

## **Guideline Vidéo 11 : Content preparation : How to prepare the content of an attractive distance learning course ?**

*By following these guidelines, trainers can create engaging, interactive, and technically proficient distance learning courses, providing an optimal learning experience for participants.*

### **1. Choice of video conferencing interface :**

Opt for a user-friendly and widely used interface to ensure easy access for your learners. Ensure a good understanding of the chosen platform's features for a smooth experience.

### **2. Segment the content into 10-15 minute units:**

Divide your content into smaller segments to facilitate learners' assimilation of information. Promote engagement by providing live feedback after short videos and encourage participant reactions.

### **3. Vary the types of presented content :**

Alternate between different formats (slides, videos, live discussions) to maintain participants' interest. Encourage active participation by including exercises, discussions, or quizzes at regular intervals.

### **4. Allocate time for interactivity:**

Foster discussions and exchanges among participants to strengthen the virtual connection. Use polling or chat tools to gather real-time feedback from learners.

### **5. Avoid monotony:**

Involve other speakers or invite experts to diversify voices and perspectives. Encourage learners to share their experiences and actively participate in the session.

### **6. Rehearse in real conditions :**

Practice your entire sequence using the chosen platform, preferably with a colleague. Test technical features and ensure smooth transitions between materials. Take advantage of your colleague's feedback to adjust your content and anticipate potential issues.

### **7. Ensure technical mastery:**

Familiarize yourself with advanced features of the platform, including screen sharing, chat, and interactive tools. Check the quality of your internet connection, microphone, and webcam.

### **8. Clearly communicate expectations :**

Inform your learners of expectations regarding participation, feedback, and interactivity. Provide a participation guide and encourage communication outside of scheduled sessions.
